



From Mattingley Parish Council:

As your Parish Council we would like to understand your views as to the future of the Shoulder of Mutton. In this letter is a link to an online survey and a paper copy to be returned by post if you prefer. Your views are incredibly important in shaping how we and the local community approach saving our pub, so it would be greatly appreciated if you could let us know what you think and also if you would be interested in helping.

As you will probably be aware the Shoulder of Mutton closed its doors 18 months ago and has stood empty since. In the last few weeks the company that owns it have decided to sell the freehold and placed the sale with Savills. The premises is being advertised as a Public House but will no doubt attract interest for a variety of purposes.

The Shoulder is registered as an Asset of Community Value. This means that with a sales process started, the current owners are required to provide a 6 month period in which the local community can present a proposal to buy and operate the pub. This has been achieved by several hundreds of local communities across the country. Such community businesses can be driven by the Parish Council or by a group of individuals from within the community (a Community Business Group).

By expressing an interest in supporting a community business you are making absolutely no commitment. At this time we are solely interested in trying to gauge potential levels of support.

Whether or not you have an interest in being part of a community business we would still very much like to hear your views about having and supporting a pub in Hazeley. PLEASE RESPOND, because numbers and evidence of community support will help us in achieving grant funding, and also give support for the pub in relation to potential future planning applications that might seek a change of use to residential development.

For most villages a pub is a vital service; it is a meeting place, communication centre and an important lynchpin of village life. Much of the appeal of our village rests on its sense of community and the amenities within it. It is the reason many people have moved here and remain here. Making sure that the village retains its pub would greatly enhance that community spirit.

Another thing to seriously consider is the impact on local house prices. There's a lot of articles out there that suggest property values can decrease quite significantly in the absence of a good local pub, especially in rural areas. That's not to say that a private buyer or developer won't buy and invest in making it a great pub, which of course would be fantastic, but losing the pub is a very real risk. A research report issued by the Plunkett Foundation suggests that local pubs owned by the community are thriving where as private enterprises are failing. You can review the 2019 report here;

10. Financing a Community Bid

Whilst we are in the very early stages of this project, we're hoping to secure expert advice and financial support from the Plunkett Foundation (www.plunkett.co.uk). The current aim is for enough funds to be raised for the community to buy the pub through grant funding, loans, donations and the community having the opportunity to buy shares.

Community shares will be backed by the value of the asset (the pub) and as finances permit may pay interest and be redeemable after a settling in period.

However, the group need an indication of potential shareholder investment to develop a detailed and costed community shares proposal and to understand whether there's enough interest within the community to make this a financially viable project. If there's little or no interest, sadly it's likely that we won't be able to continue with the project.
